
Youth Deprived of Family Ties in Jordan: The Discrimination in the Name



As part of their duties as a State Party to the Convention on the Rights of the Child, Jordan periodically submits a State report to the Committee on the Rights of the Child (CRC) on the measures they have adopted, which give effect to the rights recognized by the Convention. A reccurring point of disagreement between the CRC and Jordan is the use of classification in reference to those deprived of family ties. The following timeline summarizes the terminology used in Jordan's State reports and the relevant comments made by the CRC in their Concluding Observations:



The Information and Research Center – King Hussein Foundation (IRCKHF) is identifying the discrimination faced by orphans deprived of family ties in Jordan. Through its research, the IRCKHF has identified that there is discrimination in the name by both the State of Jordan and the CRC.
